U. S. real gross domestic product grew at a 2.2 percent annual rate during the fourth quarter of 2014 and was 2.4 percent higher than for the fourth quarter of 2013.

Total civilian employment for the fourth quarter of 2014 rose 2.2 percent compared to the corresponding period of the previous year while the workforce rose only 0.8 percent, causing the unemployment rate to drop from 7.0 percent to 5.7 percent.

A survey of professional economists by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia projects the U.S. economy to grow 3.2 percent, 2.9 percent, 2.7 percent, and 2.7 percent in 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018, respectively.


An alternative set of forecasts by Wells Fargo Bank indicates growth of 2.6 percent and 2.9 percent for 2015 and 2016.

Total state employment for the fourth quarter of 2014 rose 1.5 percent from the previous quarter and 3.0 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013.

The unemployment rate for the fourth quarter was 6.5 percent, compared to 5.6 percent in 4Q2013. The state unemployment rate was above the 5.7 percent national rate primarily because the Louisiana labor force grew faster than employment.

State sales tax collections for the fourth quarter rose 14.5 percent compared to the prior quarter and were 5.4 percent higher than for the fourth quarter of 2013. (The year-over-year growth is a continuation of the trend witnessed during recent quarters.)

Seasonally-adjusted state personal income increased 0.6 percent (\$1.2 billion) in the fourth quarter of 2014, the lowest percentage increase in the nation. Net earnings were up \$1.07 billion, dividends, interest and rents increased \$195 million, and personal transfer receipts decreased by \$46 million.


For 2014 in total, Louisiana personal income was up 3.2 percent over 2013, the 35th largest annual increase in the nation.

Industries contributing the most year-over-year growth in earnings from 4Q2013 to 4Q2014 were "Construction" (+\$1.6 billion), "Health Care and Social Assistance" (+\$809 million), and "Manufacturing" (+ \$761 million).

Northshore Employment

Total employment in the Northshore Region (the five parishes of Livingston, St. Helena, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, and Washington) was 1.3 percent higher in 4Q2014 compared to the previous quarter, and rose 3.3 percent (7,770 jobs) compared to 4Q2013.


The total civilian work force was 1.0 percent higher than the previous quarter and 4.3 percent higher than in the fourth quarter of 2013.

The unemployment rate for the fourth quarter of 2014 was 5.9 percent, compared to 6.0 percent in the previous quarter and 4.9 percent during the fourth quarter of 2013.

(Note: All regional and parish employment analyses are based on unadjusted employment data. Seasonally-adjusted data are not available at the parish level.)



The 4Q2014 value of retail sales for the region rose 9.0 percent from the previous quarter and was 8.9 percent higher than for 4Q2013.


All the parishes in the Northshore region except Washington saw gains in sales compared to the fourth quarter of 2013.

Residential Building Permits in the Northshore Region

Building permits for residential units in the region for the fourth quarter of 2014 fell 17.0 percent from the prior quarter and were 9.8 percent lower than 4Q2013, reflecting a somewhat restrained outlook for construction in the region.

On a year-over-year basis only St. Helena and Washington parishes reported gains in building permits.



How many of Southeastern's students are from the Northshore?

With approximately 14,500 students and almost 1,200 full-time employees, Southeastern Louisiana University is one of the largest economic "engines" on the Northshore.

In a typical economic impact analysis, "new money" — spending coming in from outside the region — is the primary factor in estimating impact. However, spending by residents of the region is also added in if that spending would have left the region if not for the event, business, etc. being analyzed.

As the only 4-year institution of higher education on the Northshore, spending by ALL of Southeastern's students contribute to its impact on the Northshore economy, because, if not for Southeastern, even students from the Northshore would be spending their education and living expenditures outside of the region.

Even so, it is still worth analyzing where Southeastern's students call home, because students from outside the region have different, and likely larger, economic impacts than students from the Northshore.

For the Fall 2014 semester, students enrolled at Southeastern came from 55 parishes, 44 states other than Louisiana, and 44 foreign countries.

As shown in the table below, 7,648 (52.8 percent) of the 14,498 students enrolled for the Fall 2014 semester were from the five Northshore parishes. Approximately 42.3 percent were from Louisiana parishes outside of the Northshore, 3.0 percent from states other than Louisiana, and 1.7 percent were international students from other countries.

The bar graph on the right below shows the number of students from the top 10 home parishes for enrollment in Fall 2014 along with the number from the other 45 parishes, other states, and other countries.


Mississippi, Texas, and California were the leading sources of out-of-state students in Fall 2014, home to 106, 84, and 41 students, respectively.

Nepal, home to 103 students in the Fall 2014 semester, was by far the top foreign country by number of students. The next highest countries were Nigeria and the Republic of Korea, home to nine students each.

Livingston Parish

Livingston Parish employment rose 0.9 percent over the prior quarter and grew 3.4 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013. The unemployment rate of 5.3 percent was lower than the 5.4 percent in the prior quarter but higher than the 4.4 percent of a year ago.

Initial and continuing unemployment claims in Livingston Parish were down 14.2 and 11.9 percent, respectively, compared to 4Q2013.

The value of taxable sales rose 11.7 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013, a larger percentage increase than that for the region (8.9%).

The number of homes sold in Livingston Parish was up 5.4 percent compared to 4Q2013, and median selling prices for October, November, and December 2014 were 6.8, 4.2, and 3.8 percent higher than the same months in 2013.

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





St. Helena Parish

Employment in St. Helena Parish in the fourth quarter of 2014 rose 3.4 percent compared to the same quarter of the previous year. The labor force grew 4.2 percent, causing the unemployment rate to rise to 9.0 percent from 8.4 percent in 4Q2013.

Initial and continuing unemployment claims in St. Helena Parish were down 2.0 and 38.3 percent, respectively, compared to 4Q2013.

The value of taxable sales rose 7.4 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013, trailing the 8.9 percent average gain for the region.

Building permits for residential construction fell 27.3 percent from the previous quarter but were 33.3 percent higher than for 4Q2013.







St. Tammany Parish

Total employment in St. Tammany Parish in 4Q2014 rose 3.2 percent compared to 4Q2013, slightly below the average increase for the region (3.3 percent). The workforce increased by 4.3 percent and the unemployment rate was 5.2 percent, compared to 4.2 percent in 4Q2013.

Initial and continuing unemployment claims in St. Tammany Parish were down 10.5 and 6.9 percent, respectively, compared to 4Q2013.

The value of taxable retail sales rose 6.7 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013,

short of the average gain for the region (8.9 percent).

Building permits for residential units fell 20.1 percent from the previous quarter and were 7.6 percent lower than in the fourth quarter of 2013, reflecting an uncertain outlook for residential construction activities in the parish.





Weekly Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims









Total employment in Tangipahoa Parish in the fourth quarter of 2014 grew 2.7 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2013.

The workforce rose 3.9 percent, causing the unemployment rate to rise to 7.1 percent from the 6.1 percent of a year ago.

Initial unemployment claims and continuing weeks claimed were down 11.4 percent and 18.3 percent, respectively, from 4Q2013.

The value of taxable sales rose 14.5 percent compared to the fourth quarter of the previous year,

far exceeding the 8.9 percent average for the region.





Weekly Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims





Weekly Initial Unemployment Insurance Claims








