U.S. Economy

U. S. real gross domestic product grew at a 1.4 percent annual rate during the fourth quarter of 2015 and was 2.0 percent higher than in the fourth quarter of 2014.

Total civilian employment for the fourth quarter of 2015 rose 1.4 percent compared to the corresponding period of the previous year while the workforce grew by 0.7 percent. This led to a decline in the unemployment rate from 5.7 percent to 5.0 percent.

A survey of professional economists in May 2016 by the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia projects the U.S. economy to grow 1.7, 2.4, 2.4, and 2.2 percent in 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019, respectively. An alternative set of forecasts by Wells Fargo Bank indicates gains of 1.6 and 2.2 percent in 2016 and 2017, respectively.

U.S. wages grew by 1.6 percent in 4Q2015, and total personal income increased by 1.0 percent.

STATE

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Total state employment for the fourth quarter of 2015 fell 0.5 percent from the previous quarter and 1.4 percent from 4Q2014.

The statewide labor force for 4Q2015 declined by 0.7 percent from the previous quarter and 2.6 percent from 4Q2014.

The substantial decline in the labor force led to a drop in the unemployment rate from 6.9 percent in 4Q2014 to 5.9 percent in 4Q2015.

Sales tax collections for the fourth quarter of 2015 increased 5.1 percent over the prior quarter but were 6.4 percent lower than in the fourth quarter of 2014.

Seasonally-adjusted state personal income increased 0.8 percent (\$1.6 billion) in the fourth quarter of 2015.

Net earnings were up \$659 million, dividends, interest and rents increased \$62 million, and personal transfer receipts increased by \$906 million.

Industries contributing the most quarter-overquarter growth in earnings from 3Q2015 to 4Q2015 were *Construction* (+\$489 million), *Health care and social assistance* (+\$142 million), and *Administrative and waste management* services (+\$118 million).

Earnings from *Mining* (which includes oil and gas exploration and production) declined by \$298 million from 3Q2015 to 4Q2015.

The largest year-over-year increase in earnings from 4Q2014 was for *Health care and social assistance* (+\$618 million), while *Mining* reported the largest decline (-\$1.1 billion).

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
Northshore Employment

Total employment in the Northshore Region was 0.7 percent lower in 4Q2015 than in the previous quarter, and 0.6 percent lower (-1,420 jobs) than in the fourth quarter of 2014.

The total civilian work force in 4Q2015 declined by 1.5 percent from the previous quarter and 1.7

percent from 4Q2014.


The larger decline in the work force led to a drop in the unemployment rate for the fourth quarter of 2015 to 5.3 percent, down 0.6 percent from the previous quarter and 1.1 percent from the 6.4 percent of 4Q2014.



Northshore Estimated Retail Sales

Taxable retail sales for the region in 4Q2015 increased by 4.7 percent from the previous quarter and was 1.9 percent higher than 4Q2014.

Sales tax data were not available for St. Helena Parish, but the other Northshore parishes all had year-over-year gains compared to 4Q2014.




Northshore Residential Building Permits

The number of building permits for residential units in the Northshore region (excluding St. Helena Parish—for which data were not available) issued during 4Q2015 rose by 0.3 percent from the prior quarter and was 7.2 percent higher than in the fourth quarter of 2014.

Livingston and St. Tammany parishes reported year-over-year increases of 7.1 percent and 13.4 percent, respectively, while Tangipahoa and Washington parishes reported declines of -0.7 percent and -13.6 percent, respectively.



Northshore Residential Home Sales

There were 1,660 homes sold during 4Q2015 at an average price of \$200,115. The number sold

and average price were down 15.8 and 1.7 percent, respectively, from the previous quarter.




Most popular models of new vehicles purchased by Northshore residents: 4Q2015




Northshore residents purchased 6,457 new vehicles in the fourth quarter of 2015. Three of the top five most popular models (and four of the top 10) were pickup trucks (Figure 1), with the most popular model overall being the Ford F150 with 367 purchased in 4Q2015. (Note that if sales of the Chevy 1500 and GMC 1500 — very similar GM models — were combined they would total 516.)


The top ten models shown in Figure 1 account for almost one-third (32.7 percent) of total purchases in 4Q2015, with the top five alone accounting for 21.0 percent.




The top 10 (or 11) models purchased by residents of Livingston, St. Tammany, Tangipahoa, and Washington parishes in 4Q2015 are illustrated in Figures 2-5. (St. Helena parish purchases are not shown due to the very small numbers. The leading St. Helena model in 4Q2015 was the Honda Accord with five purchased. All other models had totals of two or less.)

Livingston Parish


Livingston Parish 4Q2015 employment declined by 0.5 percent from the prior quarter, but was still 0.5 percent higher than for the fourth quarter of 2014.


The value of taxable sales rose 8.6 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014. The 2015 annual total was up 8.9 percent compared to 2014.

The number of permitted residential units rose 0.6 percent from the previous quarter and 7.1 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014.

There were 445 homes sold in Livingston Parish in 4Q2015, up 26.4 percent from 4Q2014. The average selling price in 4Q2015 was \$168,897.


Livingston Parish residents purchased 1,609 new cars and light trucks in 4Q2015, including 185 from dealers within Livingston Parish. Parish dealers also sold 117 new vehicles to residents of other parishes within Louisiana.



St. Helena Parish

Employment among St. Helena Parish residents in the fourth quarter of 2015 fell 0.8 percent (-33 jobs) compared to the same quarter of the previous year. The labor force declined by 3.6 percent, leading to a drop in the unemployment rate from 9.9 percent in 4Q2014 to 7.3 percent in 4Q2015.

The value of taxable sales rose 0.2 percent compared to the third quarter of 2014, in contrast to

the 6.0 percent average increase for the region.

There were three homes sold in St. Helena Parish in 4Q2015, with an average price of \$97,500 and a median of \$87,000.

Residents of St. Helena Parish purchased 38 new cars and light trucks in the fourth quarter of 2015.

St. Tammany Parish

The number of employed St. Tammany Parish residents in 4Q2015 was down 0.3 percent from the previous quarter and 1.2 percent from 4Q2014. This was the first year-over-year decline since 4Q2011.


The labor force declined by 2.4 percent compared to 4Q2014, leading to a decline in the unemployment rate from 6.0 percent in 4Q2014 to 4.9 percent in 4Q2015.


The value of taxable retail sales in 4Q2015 rose 1.0 percent compared to the fourth quarter of

2014. The 2015 annual total was 3.7 percent higher than in 2014.

Building permits for residential units in 4Q2015 fell 1.7 percent from the previous quarter, but increased 13.4 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014.

The number of homes sold in St. Tammany Parish and the average selling price were up 13.4 percent and down 2.3 percent, respectively, compared to 4Q2014, leading to a 10.8 percent increase in total residential sales volume.



Tangipahoa Parish

The number of employed Tangipahoa Parish residents in the fourth quarter of 2015 fell 0.3 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014. The labor force shrunk by 1.2 percent, causing the unemployment rate to fall to 6.4 percent from the 7.2 percent of 4Q2014.


The value of taxable sales increased 2.8 percent compared to 4Q2014, and the 2015 annual total was 4.9 percent above that of 2014.


Construction permits for residential units fell 1.4 percent from the previous quarter and 0.7 percent

compared to the fourth quarter of 2014.

The number of homes sold in Tangipahoa Parish and the average selling price were up 13.6 and 3.7 percent, respectively, compared to 4Q2014, leading to a 17.9 percent increase in total volume.

Tangipahoa Parish residents purchased 1,239 new cars and light trucks in the fourth quarter of 2015, including 632 from Tangipahoa Parish dealers. Local dealers also sold 599 light vehicles in other parishes of Louisiana.






Total employment in Washington Parish in the fourth quarter of 2015 fell 1.6 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014. The labor force decreased by 2.9 percent, leading to a decrease in the unemployment rate to 7.0 percent from 8.2 percent in 4Q2014.


The value of taxable retail sales in 4Q2015 rose 2.0 percent compared to the fourth quarter of 2014, and the total for all twelve months of 2015 was up 3.9 percent over 2014.

Permits for 19 residential units were issued in 4Q2015, down 13.6 percent from 22 in both 3Q2015 and 4Q2014.

Washington Parish home sales in 4Q2015 were down 11.4 percent from 3Q2014, but the average price was up 52.0 percent, resulting in a year-over-year increase in total sales volume of 34.6 percent.

Washington Parish residents purchased 324 new cars and light trucks in the fourth quarter of 2015.



Southeastern finance team named winner in national Community Bank Case Study competition

A team of finance students at Southeastern Louisiana University has won the national Community Bank Case Study competition conducted by the Washington, D.C.-based Conference of State Bank Supervisors, a nationwide organization of banking regulators from all states and U.S. territories. Southeastern's team competed against 22 other teams from 19 academic institutions.

The team of four Southeastern undergraduate students worked cooperatively with Hammond-based First Guaranty Bank in one of Southeastern's newest Real-World Ready courses, a campus-wide initiative to incorporate more hands-on, experiential learning into students' curriculum.

"Congratulations to the Southeastern students for their competition win," said Michael L. Stevens, CSBS senior executive vice president. "Each of the case studies tells us a valuable story about a real community bank and its impact on small businesses and their local community."

The competition encouraged students to explore community banking by partnering student teams with local banks to conduct original case studies, explained Danielle Lewis, associate professor of finance who served as faculty adviser for the team. The goal of the competition, she said, was to build a fundamental understanding of the community banking business, something few undergraduate students would gain through their regular course work.

The team included seniors Nicholas Byrd of Denham Springs, Tarez Arceneaux Cowsar of Springfield, Joseph Edwards of Monroe, and Andrea Villarreal of Monterey, Mexico. Each of the students will receive a \$1,000 scholarship and the opportunity to present their case study at the annual CSBS-Federal Reserve Community Bank Research and Policy Conference in the fall.
